# 'What Parents Need to Know about Monkey'

Online video calling with random strangers (B) (B) It's hardly a new internet phenomenon – but the recent demise of Omegle has prompted the creation of several similar platforms bidding to fill the vacuum. One such contender is Monkey – a service that randomly connects its users for video calls, using their mobile numbers and Snapchat account details (B).

Monkey . has surged in popularity since Omegle's shutdown in November 2023: visits to the site more than doubled within a month and have been climbing steadily ever since. Regrettably, it also seems that Monkey suffers from many of the same pitfalls as its notorious predecessor – our **#WakeUpWednesday** guide highlights these possible risks to young people in more detail.


## Hi Everyone!
