Special Meal: Fish and Chips Thursday 3rd October

Parent Consultations

We wish to welcome you to the parent consultations taking place on Thursday 3rd October and Tuesday 8th October. For this event, all main children's entrances will be open for parents to come to the area where their child is based in class. Year 4C may wish to enter at the Year 5 and 6 entrance. Foundation parents please use the Foundation doors and then turn right into the Year 3 and 4-shared area, go through the double doors into KS1 and turn left to wait in the warm in the Role Play Area outside the classrooms. For those who are new to the school, your child is actively invited to attend with you. Please feel free to take the opportunity to look around the school at the beautiful art work that the children have created.

New Home School Agreement

As part of our participation in the Leading Parent Partnership Award, we have updated our Home School Agreement. This is a document which shares the commitments we make to each other as parent, pupil and school to support your child's education. The new versions for Key Stage One and Key Stage Two are attached to this email for your perusal prior to coming to the Parent Consultations. We will then have a paper copy for parent and pupil to sign and the class teacher will sign it on behalf of the school. A copy will then be sent home later for you to keep once we have had chance to photocopy them.

Curriculum Overviews

An electronic copy of the Curriculum Overviews will be sent home shortly and a paper copy will also be available at Parents Evening for parents who wish to know how to further support their child or children in each year group. This outlines the main focus for areas of study in each curriculum area and provides helpful hints of things to talk about or do at home or when out and about this autumn. In Foundation the children receive one each half term as the curriculum is more flexible and includes topics the children initiate and wish to explore in their learning.

Parking

Eco-School

You may have noticed that during the summer holidays we had solar panels installed on the roof. We are thrilled that in less than two months we have already saved £153 and reduced our carbon footprint. So far we have produced 3043KWh of electricity, saving 1734Kg of CO² from being released into the atmosphere. We are expecting to save approximately £1400 a year and the solar panels will be paid for in 10 years. Devon County Council are also replacing our 1948 lighting system during this academic year with LED lights as part of the capital upkeep of their maintained schools. Together we are hoping that these two improvements will lead to greatly reduced electricity bills. We are also continuing to focus on our recycling; children and staff are all encouraged to save and sort their waste. The Green Team of children collect the paper waste daily from the classrooms and offices. Following our work with Sally Jackson, Future Resources Devon Education Officer, Mid Devon District Council collect the food waste from the school and kitchen. We always welcome your suggestions on how to improve as an Eco-school.

Child Protection Policy

As the nights begin to draw in and there is an autumn nip in the air we are all getting back into routines after our summer.

All classes, except foundation, now have reading books. Foundation will be receiving their books soon but are still learning their sounds at the moment. Please can I implore you to read with your children both hearing them read and read to them. Or if they are older encourage them to read independently, maybe as part of their bedtime routine. It is the single most important thing that we can do to support our children's learning across the curriculum.
