Public Health Warning

As we move into the winter months, Public Health Devon have advised us that they are expecting a significant spike in people succumbing to COVID and flu. We therefore ask that if your child is unwell and experiencing symptoms of either of these infections that you please keep them at home until they no longer have a temperature and are feeling better. If they test positive for COVID, the recommendation is that children should be kept at home for at least three days after the day that they took the test. Last winter, the school was heavily impacted by COVID with almost every member of staff and many children away, which caused further interruption to the children's education. If we can reduce the rate at which these infections spread amongst the whole school community, it would help enormously. We have a number of vulnerable children and adults within our school and we also wish to protect them.

Odd Socks Day and Anti-Bullying Week

On Monday 14th November, we would like to ask all children to wear a pair of odd socks to school. We will be using Odd Socks Day to celebrate what makes us individuals and also our families special and unique. The children will learn that others' families, either in school or in the wider world, sometimes look different from their family, but that they should respect those differences and know that families are characterised by love and care. Children are welcome to bring in or email their teachers a family photograph to show and share with their class on the day if they wish.

Odd Socks Day marks the start of our Anti-Bullying Week (14th-18th November), which is a national annual event that shines a spotlight on ways to prevent and deal with bullying. The theme this year is 'Reach Out'. Children will be taking part in a range of activities to learn more.

Phonics at home

To help parents/carers further support children at home to learn phonics, we have started sending home some video links. These speed sound lesson videos are for your child to watch and join in with at home. The lessons will enable you to see how we teach phonics in school and allow children at home to practise and consolidate what they've been taught. Children in Reception and Year 1 will have links shared via Evidence Me. Children in Year 2 who are still progressing through the Read, Write Inc phonic programme, will have their links posted on the Year 2 Google Classroom site.
