Health Snacks and Packed Lunches

Helping parents to care for children with coughs



As you know, coughs and colds

are a common part of childhood, especially during the winter. Most of these infections are caused by viruses and children recover quickly with a bit of rest and

paracetamol. However, many parents of young children can be very worried when their children are unwell and would welcome support and guidance on what to do and when to seek help.

We are writing to inform you about a simple tool that can help navigate parents through these worries. The <u>Caring</u> <u>for children with cough' leaflet</u> was produced by researchers at the University of Bristol after extensive work with parents. It explains what parents should do when looking after a child with cough and when parents should take their child to see a doctor.
