Whole Class Reading

Last term I sent out a document about how we teach reading from when the children start in Reception until Year 6. Now I would like to give you more information about the whole class reading element that was trialled across KS2 and with some Year 2 children last term, following the success of the initial trial in the summer term last year.

A team of teachers, led by the English Co-ordinator, Mrs Nisbet, have designed a Whole Class Reading system which identifies a range of high quality texts which are shared with the children each day. The books are carefully chosen to be age appropriate, engaging, introduce the children to variety of authors and sometimes link to their learning in other subjects. They are organised so that across the school the theme each week will be the same, for example, modern fiction, non-fiction linked to the children's topic, poetry, a classic book, fantasy or science fiction.

The children then read extracts from these books each day with their class teacher in a variety of ways to develop their reading skills such as fluency, stamina, expression (prosody), ability to predict and summarise, infer and comprehend.

This ensures progression and breadth in the key texts being used to teach reading across the school and being shared with the children to develop their love of reading. The children are really enjoying sharing these books together and are frequently asking to read the books for themselves. Extra copies have been purchased to provide copies in the classrooms for the children to read the whole book should they wish and this is proving very popular.

These whole class reading sessions have replaced the regular reading sessions in groups for many children and you will have noticed the teachers are not writing in the home school contact books in the way that they used to. This does not mean the children are not reading, in fact, they are reading more than ever! Class records are being kept by the teachers instead. We would ask however, that when you hear your child read at home, or if they read to themselves, that it is recorded in the Home School Contact book so we have some idea about how much reading is happening out of school.

Each week children with four entries in their home school book for reading are then given a raffle ticket to reward them for their efforts. At the end of term, they are entered into a prize draw and the winners in each class receive a book token. The more raffle tickets they can gain the greater chance they have of winning!

Devon County Council Transport Consultation

Devon County Council is consulting on its arrangements for home-to-school transport. Currently Devon County Council charges £600 per annum (with a £30.00 discount if the full-year cost is paid in full) for concessionary seat passengers and post-16 passengers. This annual charge is a contribution towards the cost of the transport they provide.

They are consulting on increasing these charges to £800 per annum from September 2023.
