Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) Programme

The Holiday Activity and Food (HAF) programme is funded by the Department of Education for those in reception to year 11 who receive income-related free school meals.

Message from the HAF Team:

We are improving the way parents can book to attend the Holiday Activities Food Programme in Devon.

We have partnered with a company called EEQU and made the process easier for parents to book and cancel should they need to.

The system will also check their eligibility so we will no longer be using unique HAF codes.

The system can be used on any device, and it makes the booking for parents a lot easier.

Parents may express an interest now and the bookings will go live on 27/03/2025 at 8.00am.

We would like to remind that we do need to protect those in school with food allergies and ask that parents do not include any food products with nuts in snack and lunch boxes.


Dartmoor Residential Trip Instalment Payment



What is Listen up, Speak up?

Listen up, Speak up is an NSPCC campaign aimed at empowering the public to take action if they're worried about a child or family.

Because when we all listen up and speak up for the people around us, we can make sure that children always come first. It might mean stepping in to help juggle childcare, providing a listening ear to a struggling teen, or calling the NSPCC Helpline if you think a child is at risk.

That's why we're offering free, bitesize training to every adult in the UK. It will show:

- · the signs a child might be at risk, and steps you can take to help
- how to approach difficult conversations to help keep children safe
- · who you can contact if you're ever
