

Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<p>Sustaining attendance at CVLC events offered to us (prior to Covid-19) and reaching East Devon finals/cluster finals in a number of these.</p> <p>Children engaged as leaders and managing activities such as refereeing and play leaders.</p> <p>The school won the swimming gala for the second year in a row.</p> <p>Additional sessions for children in Y5&6 that could not swim were offered and the take up of these was good and many of these children improved their swimming and gained their 25m badge.</p> <p>Bespoke PE sessions designed for Willand School by a professional sports coach, which was differentiated for families, ran throughout the Covid-19 lockdown to keep children active.</p> <p>Wake and Shake ran each week (both on Google Classrooms and in school).</p> <p>Increased the range of activities on offer to children through Premier Education Days of Sport including activities such as Taekwondo, Fencing and Jailball.</p>	<p>Achieve the Silver School Games Mark.</p> <p>Organise staff CPD to support newer staff and refresh existing staff members in dance and gymnastics in particular including using the library of activities provided by James Marshall of Excelsior Sports.</p> <p>Introducing new ideas to achieve the recommended 30 minutes a day of activity.</p> <p>PE noticeboard to be reinstated and updated to show activities that children have taken part in.</p> <p>Intra-school events are organised for year groups at the end of a unit and children are celebrated when they show Spirit of the Games values.</p> <p>On return to school, where normal PE lessons may not be possible, adapt teaching activities to ensure that we are still meeting the required amount of physical activity in line with government guidance for use of equipment and physical contact.</p>
